Television host and renowned chef Geoff Jansz has an exciting new project underway on the farm where he lives with his family in the Southern Highlands of NSW.

Over the years Geoff has become a household name, featuring in cooking segments as part of the Burke's Backyard team and hosting What's Cooking and Fresh TV for the Nine Network. Publications such as Australian Gourmet Traveller magazine also featured Geoff's articles profiling and promoting the best produce Australia has to offer.

Holding a cooking philosophy of using fresh seasonal ingredients to produce healthy and delicious meals, Geoff believes that cooking is something that everybody can enjoy. His quest to inspire others to discover its joys and rewards has led him to his current project – The Geoff Jansz Farm. The aim of the farm is to share philosophies, ideas and methods for creating a beautiful garden from which wholesome produce can be harvested all year round. Neutrog have been working alongside Geoff and the team at the farm with advice on soil improvement and by planning a year round fertilising program.











With soil health and 'taste' Geoff's focus, what goes into the ground has been carefully selected in all areas of the farm. Geoff says "I love creating my black magic potions of composts, liquid manures, fish extracts and such, however, for maximum success nurturing soil and the plants within, practically everybody will need to seek the advice or research from a knowledgeable source regarding supplementing your self-supply. My guys are Neutrog."

The brief was to provide organic and organic based products that hold moisture, increase organic matter and build soil health. With that in mind **Rapid Raiser** has



now been applied with initial vegetable plantings and **Seamungus** used when forming the new raised beds. Seamungus has also been dug through problem areas that have been neglected and needing improvement before being productive. Under the watchful eye of expert orchardist, Geoff Brookes, **GOGO Juice** and **Gyganic** for Fruit and Citrus have been applied to the 30+ trees in the farm orchard. Geoff said of his beloved fruit trees, "They have plenty of fruit buds and with this delicious feed we've just given them, we're looking forward to a bumper crop of outstanding apples, pears, plums, cherries, guinces and more."

Not only is Geoff planting in larger areas around the farm, he has also added pots and an elevated garden to his patio area and created 12 or so beds next to the house to represent a mixed growing area. Small amounts of each variety are being grown in close succession to provide a continuous supply of produce rather than a sudden glut. These have also been created to inspire backyard gardeners, school children and cafes with access to a small amount of land, along with community gardeners who share their plot, the workload and the produce. Geoff will also be trialling different gardening methods and varieties of seeds, all the time pursuing what's best for the table and passing on his discoveries via social media.



Spiking the interest of the next generation

In a unique step to foster and encourage younger generations, The Orchid Club of South Australia Inc. (OCSA) has established the 'Orchid in Schools' program, with three high schools currently participating.

The students are mentored by club members and encouraged in the art of orchid growing with classes, hands on sessions and establishment of student orchid clubs. There are opportunities to

demonstrate their new skills at school open days and exhibiting at OCSA monthly meetings and major shows including the Royal Adelaide Show. The program has been running at Woodville High School for a number of years with great success, and with the addition of Willunga High and Mount Barker



High, numbers involved in the agriculture classes and school orchid clubs have increased to around 100 students in 2013.

The orchid club see it as a real pleasure to be involved





in developing the skills of the next generation of orchid growers and the positive response from schools, parents and eager students has led to a plan to train further volunteers and expand the program into other interested schools. Neutrog are pleased to be sponsoring this invaluable program, providing Strike Back for Orchids Liquid Concentrate to the schools for use in classes and to a number of students for use with the orchids they have now been inspired to grow at home.

Year round fertilising for year round health

Like humans and animals, plants require regular feeding throughout the year – at least once in each season.

Happy, healthy, well nourished plants are more resistant to pests, diseases, heat stress and frost.



Keep an eye out for heat stress in ALL areas of your garden. Applying products rich in seaweed and organic

matter, like Seamungus and GOGO Juice, around your plants can help to improve the soils water holding capacity AND the plants ability to tolerate hot weather.



Vegetables & Herbs: Pull out any weeds competing for water and give your herbs and vegies a blast with Rocket Fuel.



Flowering Plants: Dead head azaleas, rhododendrons and camellias – lightly prune to shape and then apply Kahoona at a rate of 100g per plant.



Dead head roses regularly to encourage new growth and flowers. Apply 100g per plant of **Sudden** Impact for Roses every 6-8 weeks throughout summer and autumn for a beautiful rose display.



Once orchids have finished flowering, they can be repotted and divided if needed. Mix Seamungus Crumble through the orchid bark when repotting and dose with an



application of GOGO Juice to settle the plants in. The repotted orchids can be fed with Strike Back for Orchids pellets or liquid concentrate again in Spring.



Fruit Trees: Feed all stonefruit trees with Gyganic for Fruit & Citrus to encourage new growth. Apply around the dripline and water in well.

Make sure all fruit trees, including citrus have a regular supply of water over the summer months – this will reduce the risk of fruit splitting and improve fruit and flavour development.



Natives: Give natives a light trim, to maintain shape and feed with



Lawns: To encourage lush green growth over summer feed your lawns with a nitrogen boosted fertiliser such as **Upsurge** or **Sudden** Impact for Lawns.



If however, your lawn is a bit patchy and showing signs of heat stress and overuse we recommend applying Seamungus Crumble and

GOGO Juice - this combination is a little bit of "TLC" for your lawn and will help it to recover gently.



Summer flowering annuals, like petunia, zinnia and marigolds can also be fed with Sudden Impact for Roses (if they are in the

ground) or Strike Back for Orchids (if they are

The Town Pride group's 17 dedicated members have recently replanted more than 60 Petunias into large pots in the town's main street after the original plants were stolen over the Christmas period.
