To do this, there are four factors to consider. These are:

1. Appropriate plant selection.

Besides Australian natives, there are many exotic plants which are renowned for their ability to exist with minimal or no irrigation. Consider plants that come from areas such as the Mediterranean, California and South Africa, which also have dry summers and largely winter rain.

2. Mulching. Mulching prior to the warmer weather makes a huge difference to a garden. Applying a generous layer of organic mulch to garden beds can reduce your watering by up to 50% as it stops the soil from drying out, and it reduces weeding and weed seed germination. Weeds compete with plants for available moisture.

3. Watering deep. Watering below root level is far better than frequent light watering. Also, if you enrich the soil with good compost, fertiliser or use a quality water retention product, the moisture will stay where it is best needed – around the roots.

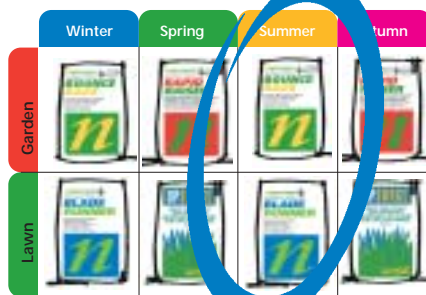
4. Feeding. "Happy, healthy plants don't get sick, and they can better withstand heat stress". This can be achieved by following Neutrog's Year Round Fertiliser Program in your garden. Summer is not generally a time when people think to feed their gardens, but the application of Bounce

Back to gardens and Blade Runner to lawns will result in sustained healthy growth, extended flowering and reduced inclination to pest and disease problems. Summer feeding with manufactured or 'chemical' fertilisers can actually be harmful to plants in the hotter months, because they promote a lot of lush new tender growth that is easily scorched in the heat.

Bounce Back is a perfect fertiliser for gardens in summer. It replaces nutrients which the plants have expended in their spring flush and allows them to continue to grow and flourish. Similarly Blade Runner used on lawns in summer ensures a healthy, lush green lawn. It is a slow release organic fertiliser that is lower in nitrogen, reducing the build up of thatch in lawns, and also reducing the need for extra mowing.

Applying organic fertiliser throughout the year results in improved soil structure and drainage, together with increased earthworm and microbial activity. This results in an increase in a plant's root growth, resulting in an increase in the plants ability to draw moisture and nutrients from the soil in the summer.

By following Neutrog's Year Round Fertiliser Program, and developing a basic, common sense approach to your gardening, you will find that you can help your garden and plants beat the heat and the water restrictions, and your garden will look even better for it!

Established in 1986, The Flower Garden is a Specialist Nursery growing David Austin Roses, Hydrangeas, Clematis, Hedging, Mediterranean and Topiary plants. It is one of the largest growers of bare rooted David Austin Roses in Australia, producing over 30,000 roses a year. These roses are distributed across Australia during the winter months. In addition, The Flower Garden stocks a range of other flowering plants in season.

The Flower Garden also carries a superb range of garden and conservatory furniture, sandstone fountains, pots and urns, tapestry wall hangings and cushions, Tuscan mirrors, glazed pots, wall plaques, lifestyle and gardening books.

However, with the release of Sudden Impact for Roses two years ago, Brian started to use this premium one step fertiliser on his roses in the display garden as well as in the propagation areas. "Our aim is to give customers ideas which they can implement in their own gardens at home", Brian Schultz, proprietor of the nursery, said. "They provide a great opportunity to view these roses growing in a garden setting, showing the different growing habits and the various ways the roses can be used in the garden – something not often found in other nurseries. Books and catalogues do not provide the true colour and perfume of these roses, which can only be appreciated 'in the flesh'. We plan to extend and change the display gardens over the next few years, focusing on plants and planting schemes which use less water and are suited to our Mediterranean climate."

With over 20 years experience in the horticultural industry, Brian and his wife Merridy, have a reputation for growing plants of exceptional quality. To achieve this, they had until recently been using a combination of Neutrog's organic based Rapid Raiser and a manufactured or chemical fertiliser which was higher in Potash.

gardens," Brian said. "Recently, for example, with the focus on water restrictions, we are actively trying to reassure our customers that they can still have the garden they want and save water. Most people are surprised when we tell them that our rose display garden is only watered 5-6 times during the whole year. To achieve this we obviously mulch well and follow the principles of efficient watering practices, such as drip irrigation and long slow soakings."

Until recently The Flower Garden's only outlet was at Nairne in the picturesque Adelaide Hills. Spring 2003 has seen them open an Adelaide store, The Flower Garden Express, in the Adelaide Central Market. This new store is brimming with many of the plants and products that customers expect from this leading nursery retailer, together with an extensive range of potted culinary herbs and citrus, a wide selection of easy care succulents, as well as a range of beautifully wrapped flowering gifts 'to go'.

The Flower Garden is having an Autumn Rose Show at Nairne from Friday 26th to Sunday 28th March, 2004 from 10am to 4pm.

Keen rose growers realised the importance of Potassium in increasing both quantity and quality of flowering, as well as producing sturdy healthy plants. These are more resistant to fungal disease than plants with soft, excessively luxuriant growth, which results from applications of fertiliser higher in Nitrogen than Potassium. Sudden Impact for Roses is an organic based fertiliser which has added Potassium and Trace Elements to make it a premium 'one step' fertiliser, designed specifically for roses. It is recommended that Sudden Impact for Roses should be applied in spring, summer and autumn for optimal results.

Rose growers across South Australia and Victoria, both amateur and professional, who purchased Sudden Impact For Roses in the past two years, have experienced excellent results with their roses.

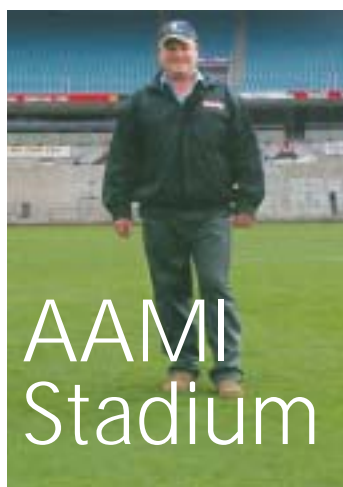

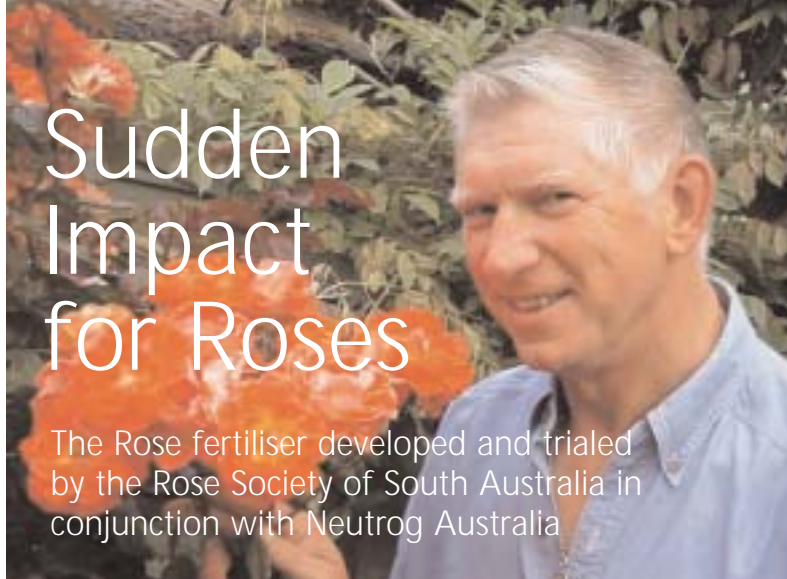

behind the scenes to keep the oval looking good", Jamie said. "We mow the field three times a week, taking nearly 2 hours to create the patterned effect, and up to eight times a week prior to the SANFL Grand Final and AFL matches.

In the retail market, Sudden Impact for Roses has up until now only been available in a brightly coloured, red and white resealable 10 kg bucket, which can be recycled as a picking bucket for rose blooms. Containing a measured 100 gram scoop, this bucket feeds 100 roses. However, significant consumer demand has seen the launch this spring of a 1.5 kg bucket. This smaller size will be ideal for gardeners with smaller gardens or with only a few roses.

Drought proofing your roses.

With many parts of Australia facing the prospect of further or continuing water restrictions, one way to drought proof your roses is by making them stronger and healthier. The best way to do this is to feed them with Sudden Impact for Roses in spring, summer and autumn, and Bounce Back in winter. Many people would think that feeding plants makes them too lush and soft and more sensitive to drought and heat, yet this is not always the case. Feeding your roses with Sudden

Impact for Roses actually makes the cell wall of the rose stronger and more able to cope with environmental stresses.

Despite the drought in their area, and the resulting severe water restrictions, Hopeton Fuel and Nursery in the Southern Mallee has received great feedback from customers who have used Sudden Impact for Roses. "We have had very positive reports from our customers about this new product", owner Chris Pridgeon said. "Several have commented that it is the best year that their roses have had, despite the drought conditions. I noticed the same results with the roses in my own garden", he continued. "I fed our roses in September/October and again after the rains in February. The lushness and dark healthy colour of their foliage was fantastic, not to mention the amazing amount of blooms. We are honestly able to recommend this product to our customers, knowing that they will get great results."

Replacing the divets after each match or practice session is another labour intensive activity. This is done by hand with a specially designed fork which enables the turf to be lifted and re-laid, almost without any trace of disturbance."

"We do a major renovation of the grounds each year after the end of the football season. This process takes up to 5 weeks, during which time the field undergoes deep aeration with specialised equipment to loosen up the compacted soil. The turf is scarified, and 150 tonnes of new soil is applied as a top dressing, prior to re-seeding. The turf has a base of couch with rye and winter grass."

"The key to having such a lush looking yet hard wearing playing field is to encourage healthy growth of the turf and having good healthy soil.

We use Neutrog's Blade Runner and Upsurge as part of our fertiliser program with great results. Blade Runner is applied in late August, with Upsurge used in the warmer weather. The organic component of these fertilisers help to improve the turf's water holding capacity, as well as encouraging earthworm activity. Searching under the divets will nearly always reveal some healthy fat worms."

"When we compare our budget to those of other AFL Stadiums such as The Melbourne Cricket Ground and The Telstra Dome, we operate on less than one tenth of their budget and yet we are still able to have an excellent playing surface. Upsurge and Blade Runner play a significant role in getting these great results, and their cost effectiveness helps to keep us within budget".

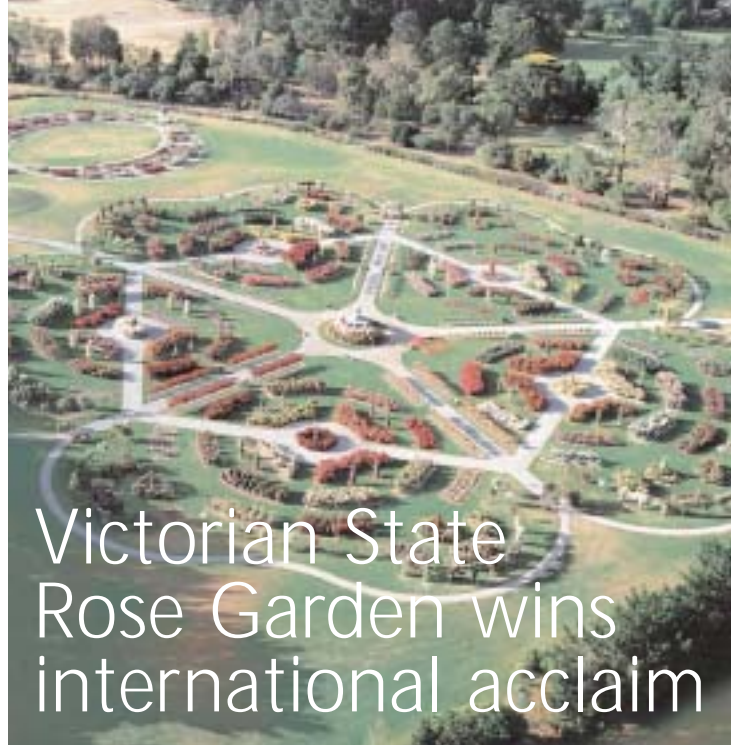

The 'Award of Garden Excellence' was presented to the Victorian State Rose Garden for outstanding achievement in developing and promoting the rose. This puts this garden in a very exclusive group of rose gardens across the world which have been recognised by this award. Other rose gardens to have received the Award include La Roserie de l'Hay in France, Carriglia' Tuscany in Italy, and Dixon Park, Belfast, Northern Ireland.

Situated in the grounds of historic Werribee Park Mansion, the Victorian State Rose Garden was first opened to the public in 1986. This recent award confirms that it is the best rose garden of its type in Australia. More than 5000 roses are planted in this 6.8 hectare garden, which is laid out in a symbolic tudor rose shaped design. The garden showcases every type of rose, from old fashioned to modern. It also includes a heritage rose border

featuring roses of historical significance and a worldwide selection of species roses. Recent additions to the Victorian State Rose Garden are beds of David Austin and Australian bred roses. This spectacular collection of roses ensures that the public can see colour and contrast through the seasons.

Amazingly, this garden is run and maintained by volunteers. Of the 110 members of the Victorian State Rose Garden Supporters Group, between 30 and 50 volunteers attend each week to ensure that the Rose Garden is maintained at a very high standard.

Part of the maintenance program includes the regular application of Rapid Raiser, which has resulted in stronger rose bushes with better growth, excellent performance and less susceptibility to disease. Trials of Sudden Impact for Roses are currently underway.
