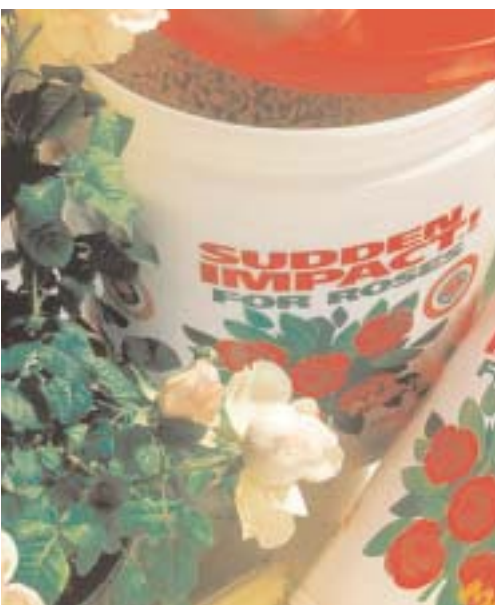

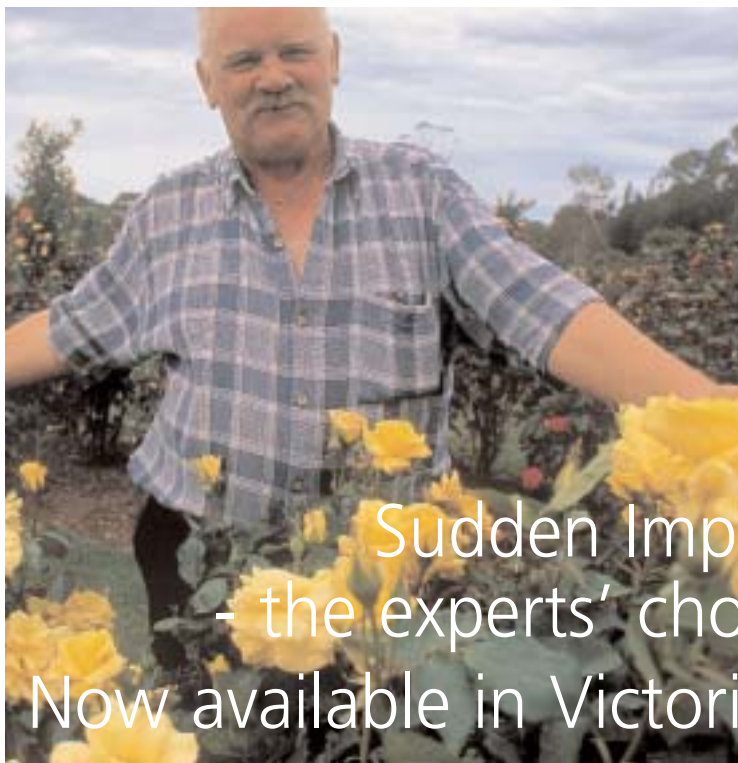

Sudden Impact for Roses - the experts' choice for your roses. Now available in Victoria and New South Wales

This new rose fertiliser, released in South Australia in spring 2001, stands out from the other fertiliser products.

Originally developed by the Rose Society of South Australia, in conjunction with Neutrog Fertilisers, its formulation has now been enhanced with the input and guidance of the Rose Society of Victoria and The Rose Society of New South Wales. This has been carried out to tailor the product to suit the specific needs of rose growers in each of these states.

Sudden Impact for Roses is now used by the principal rose growers in 3 states, including the Victorian State Rose Garden - Werribee Park, (which received The 'Award for Garden Excellence' from the World Federation of Roses Societies in Glasgow, Scotland in August 2003) and the Morwell Rose Garden in Victoria,

It has also been trialed and has been incorporated into the regular feeding program of the recently opened Hunter Valley Gardens in New South Wales, which contains 30,000 roses.

Previously, most experienced rose growers used Potassium Sulphate as their own "secret" ingredient to boost rose flowering and performance. Potassium increases the quantity and quality of flowering, as well as producing sturdy healthy plants. They are more resistant to fungal disease than plants with soft, excessively luxuriant growth, which result from applications of fertiliser high in Nitrogen.

Sudden Impact for Roses is an organic based fertiliser, which has added Potassium and Trace Elements to make it a premium 'one step' fertiliser, designed specifically for roses. It is recommended that

Sudden Impact for Roses should be applied in spring, summer and autumn for optimal results.

Rose growers across New South Wales and Victoria have experienced excellent results with their roses. Sudden Impact for Roses has been trialed extensively by members of the Rose Society of Victoria and The Rose Society of New South Wales, whose members range from keen amateurs to professional growers.

They found that applications of Sudden Impact for Roses consistently showed:

- An increase in the number of flowers on each rose bush
- An increase in the quality of individual rose blooms
- Continued general plant vigour and sturdy growth



- An improvement in the health of the plants with increased resistance to fungal diseases such as black spot, rust and powdery mildew, resulting in a significant reduction in the need for preventative spraying by up to two thirds.

The Rose Society of New South Wales has recently also added its endorsement to Sudden Impact for Roses. Its President and renowned rose breeder, Richard Walsh, said that "Every one of the members who trialed the product was happy with the results, especially the way the roses got a surge of growth at the beginning."

"One member reported that he had some roses earmarked for replacement because they were not performing, but after only a half a season of using Sudden Impact for Roses, he changed his mind and the roses continue to flourish."

Sudden Impact for Roses is available in brightly coloured, red and white resealable 1.5 kg or 10 kg buckets, which can be recycled as a picking bucket for rose blooms. Containing a measured 100 gram scoop, these buckets feed 15 or 100 roses. The smaller size is ideal for gardeners with smaller gardens or with only a few roses.

With over 25 years experience working with turf and lawns, Brenden Lennon knows all the dirt on growing and maintaining good courts and golf courses.

He is a qualified Greenkeeper, who worked on the maintenance of golf courses for ten years prior to establishing Lennon Grass Courts. Over the past 15 years he has built up this business, maintaining and servicing over 100 private tennis courts throughout Adelaide and the Barossa Valley.

Lennon Grass Courts construct new grass courts, as well as resurfacing and maintaining existing courts each season. The work includes mowing, line marking, irrigation, aeration and coring, scarifying and of course, fertilising, as well as weed, insect and disease management. They also resurface bowling club greens with newer varieties of couch grass and

Brenden continued, "The addition of extra organic matter in the form of organic based fertilisers is a great way of improving the soil structure. This in turn improves the soil's water holding capacity, the water penetrates further down, and the roots extend deeper into the soil. The turf is also hardier and more heat and drought tolerant. This translates into a dramatic reduction in quantity and frequency of water usage, often by up to half.

"We now use Neutrog's organic based lawn fertilisers in our maintenance program for all our grass courts. Blade Runner when we core all courts in winter, Upsurge in early spring and Blade Runner again in Summer."

Returning Canberra's Old Parliament House Gardens to their former glory

Old Parliament House and its famous Gardens are located in the heart of the Parliamentary Zone in the Nation's Capital, Canberra. During the 1930s and 40s the gardens played a significant role in the social and political life of the National Capital.

In the early 1930's, shortly after the opening of the Provisional Parliament House, Robert Broinowski, the Secretary of the Joint House Department, set about establishing gardens to the east and west of the House. The period from 1931 to 1939 saw the creation of the formal gardens on either side of the House. Though funds were limited in the depression, Broinowski pushed on, and developed the rose gardens using donations from Australians from all walks of life.

In later years, the gardens underwent many changes, often to their detriment. In the 1980's when Parliament moved to its new home, use and interest in the gardens, diminished.

The National Capital Authority is currently working on a major reconstruction project to restore the Gardens to their former glory.



Features such as seating pavilions, pergolas, rose arbours, paths and gateways are to be added to reinforce the 1930's design of the gardens. The rose beds, which are an integral part of the Gardens, will be reconstructed to their original layout and replanted with roses representing different themes. The plantings will be diverse, comprehensive and an attraction to rose experts and the general public.

On the House of Representative side, The Ladies' Rose Garden will feature modern roses, hybrid teas, floribunda and standards, with miniature roses planted at the edges of the beds. There will be a large circle of twelve climbing roses dedicated to six Liberal and six Labor Prime Ministers, with a central bed of 'Peace' roses, surrounded by a lavender border as the centrepiece. The John and Elizabeth Macarthur Rose Garden, named after the founders of the Australian merino wool industry, are also on the House of Representatives side, and will be predominantly planted with tea roses.

In the Senate Garden, the rose garden designed by Rex Hazelwood (Hazelwood Bros Pty Ltd, Sydney rose and tree specialists) will include diverse varieties and tell the story of the rose. Interpretative plaques will be located throughout the gardens to inform visitors of the history of the gardens, tell of memorable occasions or personalities associated with the gardens, and guide visitors throughout their experience.

The major garden reconstruction began in 2000. In total, 6,000 roses will be planted, along with 14,000 perennials and 5,000 annuals. Planting will occur between June and August 2004. Rapid Raiser will be incorporated into the soil at the time of planting. The roses will then receive applications of Sudden Impact for Roses in spring, summer and autumn each year. The Gardens will be formally opened in December 2004.

When completed, this will be a world class attraction. William A. Grant, international garden writer,

photographer, contributing editor to Botanica's Roses, and chief editor for the paperback edition, saw the drawings and plans for the Old Parliament House Rose Garden and wrote: "I was struck immediately by the intelligent arrangement of the different kinds of roses – as well as the excellent selection to represent the wide variety of roses. If you carry through with the plan, the Canberra collection could easily be among the best in the world."

Following the spirit of patronage that occurred in the 1930's, Australians from all walks of life can contribute \$100 to support one of 6,000 new rose bushes. This contribution covers the cost of the plant, preparation and planting, and on-going maintenance for at least ten years. Patronage can then be renewed. Patrons' names will be recognised on significantly placed plaques within the Old Parliament House Gardens.

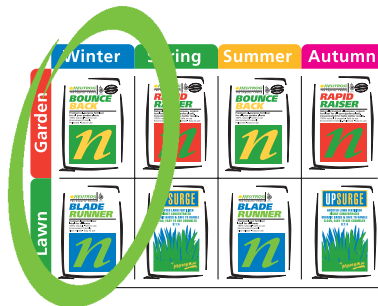

This easy to follow Program makes people rethink their beliefs about when and how often they fertilise. The belief that they should only feed in autumn and spring is only valid for 'chemical fertilisers'.

Chemicals are leached too readily in winter and require higher soil temperatures to be taken up by the plant. In summer, they are ineffective, because they often promote lush new growth that is tender and gets burnt in the heat of this season.

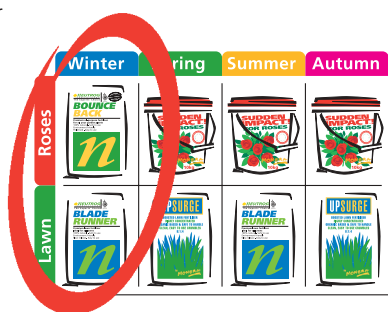
However, when it comes to using organic fertilisers, these can be applied with great results all year round. Winter is the perfect time to apply Bounce Back to your garden and Blade Runner to your lawn. Though this may not produce visible results at the time, the benefits occur below the ground. Strong root growth is encouraged, despite the cold conditions. More root growth means a larger surface area to draw nutrients from the soil. This results in a more exuberant flush of spring growth as the temperature rises. Unlike water soluble chemical fertilisers, Bounce Back and Blade Runner break down slowly, without rapid leaching.

The end result of using organic fertilisers in your garden during winter, is that your plants and lawns will be more vigorous and healthy, and they will have a head start in spring.

But what about your roses?

Since the initial trials of Sudden Impact For Roses, many people have found that using this product on their roses in spring, summer and autumn, gives them the best results. Both Neutrog and commercial growers, such as Ross Roses, the South Australian based rose nursery, are strong advocates of supplementing this with winter feeding. Andrew Ross, Manager of Ross Roses says "We have found that feeding our roses with Bounce Back in late July gives our plants a vital boost, enriching the soil to produce healthy plants. This results in a better display of blooms in spring".
